


## Who we are

We are the European Network on Independent Living.
In short, we are called 'ENIL'.

We are an organisation that works to promote independent living in Europe.

Independent living is to be able to choose how, where and with whom you want to live.
All people should have the right to live independently and to be part of the community.



For example, many people with disabilities:

Live in institutions
 away from their families, friends
 and other people.







- Are not allowed to make their own choices about their lives.
- Do not get the support they need to live independently.



At ENIL, we want the European Union to be a place where all people with disabilities can take part in the community and get the support they need to live independently.



We also want the European Union to respect the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities.

The UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities is an agreement that says which rights people with disabilities have and how countries should protect these rights. In short, we call it 'the UN Convention'.



The European Union and all its countries have signed the UN Convention.

That means they agreed to do what the UN Convention says to protect people with disabilities.



Amongst others,
the UN Convention says
that people with disabilities have the right
to live independently
and to be part of the community.



# Our work

Our work focuses on 4 activities:

1. Spreading the word about independent living and the rights of people with disabilities.

We organise activities to promote independent living.
For example:

We made the 5<sup>th</sup> of May
the **European Independent Living Day**.
On this day every year,
people with disabilities all over Europe
organise events and protests
for the right to independent living.



Also, every two years,
we organise the **Freedom Drive**.
This is a big event
that brings together people with disabilities,
their families, their friends
and everyone who wants to stand up
for the right to independent living.
The event lasts 3 days.
During these 3 days,
people have the chance to take part
in events and discussions
about independent living.





The next Freedom Drive
will take place in Brussels
on 26, 27 and 28 September 2022.

There is also a protest and a party.



# 2. Talking to people who make laws and decisions in Europe

People with disabilities have the right to take part in all decisions about their lives. We are the ones who know our needs best. Nothing should be decided about us without us.



This is why we talk to people
who make laws and decisions in Europe.
Sometimes we meet them in person
and sometimes we send them letters
and documents
explaining the views of people with disabilities
on important topics.



This way, we can help them to understand the situation of people with disabilities in Europe and to work to make things better.

#### 3. Bringing people with disabilities together

We organise meetings and activities in which people with disabilities and their organisations can take part, share their experiences and learn from each other.

This way we can stand together for our right to independent living.



# 4. Collecting useful information about the situation of people with disabilities

We often make surveys
and ask people with disabilities
all over Europe
to share their experiences and views
on important topics.

This way, we collect information about:


- The problems people with disabilities face in different countries
- The situation for people with disabilities who live in institutions.
- What different countries in Europe do to help people with disabilities to live independently.

Since 2012,

ENIL has a Youth Network.

This is a group of young people with disabilities who work together to promote the rights of young people with disabilities in Europe.



Any person between 18 and 35 years old can join ENIL's Youth Network.

Having a Youth Network helps ENIL to take the views of young people with disabilities into account in all its work.

The members of ENIL Youth Network come together to discuss important topics for young people with disabilities in Europe. They also choose the people who can make decisions for the Youth Network.
